Investment Management Services RFP # 3157 Awarded to PFM Asset Management LLC

The Finance Department has identified an Investment Management Service agreement between PFM Asset Management Services (FPM) and the Marion County School District. This agreement is the result of RFP #3157 which was originally entered into on June 10, 2008.

Ms. Olga Swinson, Chief Finance Officer, is requesting The District to "piggyback" this agreement (see attached memo from Ms. Swinson). A copy of the Marion County School District Bid Tabulation and Award is attached. The vendor, PFM Asset Management LLC, has agreed in writing (attached) to extend the same terms and conditions as the agreement with Marion County School District. The term of this contract will be from January 1, 2012- December 31-2012. The Board's Attorney has reviewed and approved this contract via email dated December 12, 2012.

It is anticipated that the costs for this service will not exceed \$70,000 and will be paid from General Revenue funds. The District is permitted to "piggyback" this service under Florida Administrative Code 6A.012(6).

Call to Order

Chairperson Judi Zanetti called the regular session of the Marion County School Board to order at 6:00 p.m. with Mr. Ron Crawford, Mr. Steve Hering, Mr. Bobby James, Mrs. Sue Mosley, Attorney Beverly Morris, and Secretary, Superintendent Jim Yancey, present. The Chairperson gave the vision of the school district: Leading the State in Raising Student Performance.

<u>Inspiration and Pledge</u>

Ms. April Liles, Food Services Coordinator, provided the inspiration and Kaylin Ricks, third grade student from Dr. N. H. Jones Elementary, led *The Pledge*. Afterwards she presented Kaylin with a plaque for submitting the winning menu out of 2,500+ entries for the *Healthy Meals & Minds* contest.

Hammett Bowen, Jr. Elementary School Parent, Mrs. Carol Robinson, expressed concern for her exceptional education student being retained in third grade due to failure of the FCAT. Superintendent Yancey responded to her concerns and requested she schedule a meeting with him and the appropriate staff to discuss alternatives, i.e., an alternative assessment that does not provide for a regular diploma; MacKay Scholarship.

Mrs. Carolyn Torrey, Parent, addressed the Board regarding her concerns about a number of topics. Attorney Morris told the Board members and the Superintendent that Mrs. Torrey has made her concerns known to Board members, the Superintendent and numerous school personnel; that appropriate investigations have been conducted and replies made to Ms. Torrey. Attorney Morris advised the Board and Superintendent that, in view of these previous responses, they should permit Mrs. Torrey to speak, but should request that Attorney Morris prepare responses on their behalf, if they wish any additional responses to be made.
